5th Grade Behavior Expectation and Procedures

The St. Mark Catholic School family is grounded in Christ-like love for all people. In our 5th grade family we have certain expectations to ensure safety, spiritual, and academic flourishing for all students in their mission as Christ's disciples. Our 5th grade classroom expectations include being respectful, responsible, and reverent at all times. Below is a detailed outline of our classroom expectations:

1. Respect

- a. Show respect and kindness to peers, teachers, and other staff- NO BULLYING POLICY
- b. Listen when the teacher is talking
- c. Raise your hand to speak or stand

2. Responsibility

- a. Follow directions quickly
- b. Be safe and help others to be safe
- c. Be honest
- d. Turn in homework and assignments on time

3. Reverence

- a. Show Christ's love to all people at all times
- b. Show reverence during times of prayer (ex: Mass)

These expectations will be explained to students on the first day of school. At the beginning of each month, students will receive a behavior log to track their behavior. If behavior expectations are not met, students will have a consequence such as losing time at recess. Parents and guardians please sign your child's behavior log at the end of each week. If students have minimal behavior marks, students will have a quarterly reward, such as a party.
