Parents,

As we begin the year 2019, we continue to explore, decide and improve. From our ever-changing school makeup, one that continues to reflect our community like no other school in our area, to the societal changes that tempt and test our children, and our self, every day, to the daily movement of what is accepted in our world by the ebb and flow of knowledge and of ignorance of some. We explore and discover what is best for our school community. We make decisions on not what society says is correct, but what our Catholic faith teaches us. And we seek improvement every day, from continually looking inward to what is working well and what needs changing to make our school the best it can be.

Some of you know our recent story of the changes that have affected our school. In the fall of 2009 I began as the principal of St. Mark Catholic School, having come from Bishop Chatard High School as an assistant principal, and before that from Scecina Memorial High School as their Athletic Director. I had never taught or worked in an elementary school before I arrived at St. Mark Catholic School. There were some definite immediate challenges that we faced as a school. Enrollment was on the decline at 165 students. The St. Mark parish was supporting the school financially at a high rate (over 30% of the schools budget), and the morale of the school's staff and students needed improving.

We explored what needed to be improved immediately, involved our parents, our students, and our staff, rolled up our sleeves and went to work. But with changes came resistance. We had families that did not buy into what we were doing. The increase in student discipline expectations, the increased academic rigor, the change in our spiritual involvement in our everyday activities, and our welcoming of all students was not universally accepted by some. Some families decided to change schools and some new families decided to come to St. Mark Catholic School and be a part of these changes.

We did away with our acceptance of unwanted drama from people that did not have our Catholic Mission in their heart. We changed the culture of our teachers and staff by being examples of kindness, hard work, and a strong faith in God, which we shared daily through prayer, through our words, and through how we treated our students, our parents, and each other. By walking the walk that we talked, we hold ourselves accountable to the same standards that we expected from others.

We began to improve our communication with our parents, to our students, and to our parishioners. We became known throughout the Archdiocese of Indianapolis as a school that challenged their students, no matter what level they were at, and built upon the academic foundation that their parents had laid to prepare them for their future. We were seen as a school that put our faith first, before anything else. The word was out that St. Mark Catholic School was accepting of all of God's children, those that were white, brown, black, and every color in between. Our school began to look more Catholic, like the universal church that we have always been.

As we continued to grow from 165 students in 2009 to our current 395 students, we began to attract teachers and staff that wanted to be a part of this changing culture. They wanted to teach in a school where they could not only share their faith in God but grow in their own faith. They saw the partnership we have with our student's parents and wanted to experience that partnership. They desired to teach students that represented our world and the diversity that it has, right in their classrooms.

With changes come challenges, but our approach has always been to only make changes if they help our students. Adding HVAC in 2011 and beginning to include 1 on 1 Chromebooks for every student in grades 2-8 in 2012. Increasing the opportunities for faith growth each year to include more of the Rosary, Eucharistic Adoration, and most importantly prayer in each day. Adding the main office to its current location, renovating the main entrance to make it more inviting, replacing the roof over the East wing of the school, and much more has improved and updated our infrastructure to prepare our building for its next 70 years.

And as the 70th graduating class comes up to the altar on May 21, 2019, to get their diplomas, the Class of 2019 will have been the first class since I have been principal to go from Pre-Kindergarten through 8th grade. They will have experienced the many positive changes that we have made to help them get a better Catholic education. They will have had more opportunities to grow academically, more chances to give service to others, and they will have had the good fortune to have experienced more ways to grow in their faith than any class previously.

So as you fill out your Letter of Intent (and return it by next Friday at 3:30 pm) please do so with the knowledge that you are committing to something special at this school. You are signing your children up for more than an academic opportunity. You are helping them to establish friendships that will last until they are very old, to learn that to give of themselves is more important than to give to themselves, and they will learn that God, through His son, Jesus Christ, loves them dearly. Please pray that God continues to allow us to bring others closer to Him through our ministry at St. Mark Catholic School. Have a great weekend and we will see you at Mass with your children!

NEWS: We now have tuition assistance available for Pre-Kindergarten Students for 2019-2020 school year! The tuition assistance will be based on family size and income. We will use the SGO income and family size scale to determine eligibility and amount of assistance. Please stop by the main office for more details. If you are going to apply for tuition assistance for your child(ren) for 2019-2020, you will need to submit a copy of your 2018 taxes. We will need a copy of the front page of your 2018 Federal Tax return that shows the dependents listed by name and your adjusted gross income. You can bring a copy into the Main office or you can email them to Mr. Albertson at: ralbertson@stmarkindy.org.We have three types of tuition assistance: Indiana Choice Scholarships (Vouchers), SGO Scholarships (Tax Credit Scholarship), and our new Pre-Kindergarten Tuition Assistance Scholarship.
